

CORONADO/MAINLAND SHUFFLEBOARD CLUB

Saturday, March 7, 2015

The meeting was called to order promptly at 10:30 AM by President Al Best who lead the membership in a prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance. All officers except Mary Ann Pabst were present. ***The new club cards were presented by Betty Buccini. Some were left at the Parks and Rec. office for distribution. The new yellow business cards will be available to folks interested in our club. It features our playing hours, special social events, as well as contact information. ***Al Bessette explained the Thursday games consisting of 4 games beginning at 9 AM. *** Bonnie and Randy have volunteered to be co-webmasters with Bill Boyes. *** Betty, our treasurer, reported that the current balance is xxxxxxxx.

Liz and the Mayor will be invited to our banquet. The committee reports that there will be many, good door prizes. *** The Northern District has established a Hall of Fame. Selected from C/ML are Dennis Buelk, Edna Triplett, Al Bessette, Dorine Bessette, and Stanley Williamson. *Singles-Mingles is scheduled on March 11 and 24 at 9 AM. Bring lunch. Six games will be played. *** Rex made State Amateur. *** Resurfacing of the courts will be scheduled for this summer. We may lose use of the courts for a few days. All the courts's paint is ground off down to the bare concrete. Green paint gets rolled on next. A stencil is used to mark the white lines. When the paint dries the contractor (usually Nidy) waxes all the courts. The length of time we lose use of the court usually depends on how many workmen are sent to do the job. *** Al and Liz inspected our facility checking out safety problems. Liz, Director of Parks and Recreation has already made several improvements. *** It was reported that Floyd has been hospitalized as has Kay Hanson. Al reported that we have been going through glass beads at a very high rate. Bill Boyes suggested that when swinging the beading tube that we be careful not to swing from side to side since 1/3 of the bead go into the gutter. He said that if we bead the middle 2/3 of the court, the beads will spread themselves out and we won't lose half to the gutter. Discussion followed about recycling the beads, It was pointed out that when there is pollen in the air the beads are affected negatively. ***The Constitutional Amendment was passed unanimously.
